



Development of Breastfeeding Education Protocol and Educational Content at University of Washington Medical Center

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Background & Issue

With clear scientific evidence supporting benefits of breastfeeding, UWMC Lactation Services worked to receive designation as a "Baby Friendly Hospital" in 2009 from the Baby Friendly Hospital Initiative (BFHI), a global initiative by the UNICEF and WHO, by fulfilling the *Ten Steps to Successful Breastfeeding*, which serve as guidelines to create the optimal environment for early initiation and continued success of breastfeeding in all newborns. However, as UWMC is up for re-evaluation by BFHI in 2014, UWMC must meet the additional standards regarding prenatal breastfeeding education in order to be re-designated as a Baby Friendly Hospital and maintain its high-quality patient care for the maternal and infant population.

Project Goals & Objectives

To develop a patient education plan and patient education material to supplement the UWMC Infant Feeding Policy and meet the prenatal breastfeeding education standards documented as Step 3 of the UNICEF/WHO Ten Steps to Successful Breastfeeding guidelines by:

- Identifying education needs of prenatal patients in cooperation from UW Medicine-associated prenatal clinics
- Designing a protocol for implementing uniform breastfeeding education in all prenatal patients going through care from the UW Medicine network
- Designing methods for evaluating learning of prenatal breastfeeding education in compliance with BFHI standards
- Developing breastfeeding education materials that include the required breastfeeding topics from the UNICEF/WHO Baby Friendly Hospital Initiative

Methods

- Review of UNICEF/WHO guidelines and additional literature review and develop new "UWMC Breastfeeding Education Plan" to meet BFHI standards to qualify as a Baby Friendly Hospital
- E-mail survey to all UWMC associated prenatal clinics to identify patient education needs
- Review of current UWMC breastfeeding education materials and additional outside resources to determine education topic needs
- Development of an all-inclusive breastfeeding education material to be used as supplement teaching material in 1:1 education sessions and in digital format on UWMC Lactation Services website

Anticipated Impact

- All prenatal patients from UWMC associated clinics will receive comprehensive breastfeeding education
- Mothers will be able to make more informed choices on breastfeeding, optimally leading to increased breastfeeding rates
- Practitioners can provide effective breastfeeding education with step-by-step protocol and allinclusive education material
- UWMC will meet prenatal education requirements and become re-designated as a Baby Friendly Hospital

Results: Deliverables

- 1. Written protocol: "UWMC Breastfeeding Education Plan for Prenatal Women-Prenatal Clinics"
 - Supplements UWMC's Infant Feeding Policy and qualifies for Step 3 of UNICEF/WHO Ten Steps to Successful Breastfeeding guidelines
 - Includes the protocol and curriculum for prenatal breastfeeding education to be offered to all pregnant women at the UWMC-associated prenatal clinics
 - Outlines the three-step breastfeeding education implementation protocol
 -) Assessment stage: Assessment of patient's prior knowledge/experience and learning readiness
 - 2) Education stage: Provide education on all required topics by the BFHI Guidelines
 - B) Evaluation stage: Evaluate patient's learning according to BFHI evaluation criteria

2. Patient Education Booklet: "The Breastfeeding Timeline"

- Includes all key breastfeeding topics as required by BFHI
 - Benefits of breastfeeding
 - Importance of exclusive breastfeeding for 6months
 - o Early initiation of breastfeeding
 - Benefits of early skin-to-skin contact
 - o Rooming-in on a 24 hour basis
 - Baby-led feeding
 - Frequency of feeding and establishing supply
 - Benefits of continued breastfeeding after intro of solid foods
- Focuses on key points in timeline format for easy comprehension
